Morning Keynote Speaker**Dr. Madlyn Hanes, Chancellor,
Penn State Harrisburg**

Dr. Hanes is Chancellor of Penn State Harrisburg, the Capital College. As Chancellor, she serves as the chief executive and academic officer of the college. Penn State Harrisburg is a comprehensive undergraduate and graduate school, offering two associate, 28 baccalaureate, 20 masters, and two doctoral degrees, and enrolls the largest number of graduate students in south central Pennsylvania. Dr. Hanes joined Penn State University in 1988 as the chief executive officer of Penn State Delaware County Campus. In 1997, she was named chief executive officer of Penn State Great Valley, the graduate campus of Penn State serving southeastern Pennsylvania, and in 1998, head of its newly formed School of Graduate Professional Studies. In July 2000, Dr. Hanes was named Provost and Dean of Penn State Capital College, heading the Penn State Harrisburg and Penn State Schuylkill campuses. In 2005, Dr. Hanes assumed the title of Chancellor, Penn State Harrisburg.

Dr. Hanes received her B.A. in English and Speech, and an M.A. in speech-language pathology from the University of Florida. In 1976, she was awarded a Ph.D. in curriculum and instructional leadership from the University of Florida and a C.C.C. in speech-language pathology from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association. Dr. Hanes holds the rank of Professor of Education.

Hanes has served as a consultant to international ministries of education and boards of higher education in Puerto Rico, Ecuador, Israel, and Korea, including a special appointment to the University Council of Jamaica by the Prime Minister from 1987-89. In 1999-2000, while on leave from Penn State, she served as the Senior Advisor to the Chancellor of the University of Georgia System, overseeing a management review of its 34 higher education institutions in conjunction with the Governor's budget and policy office.

In 1997, Penn State faculty colleagues created the Madlyn L. Hanes Faculty Award to recognize outstanding and continuous contributions of faculty members to the campus community. In 1998, Dr. Hanes received the Penn State University Award for Administrative Excellence; in 1999, the Visionary of the Year by the Great Valley Chamber of Commerce; in 2002, the Bette Landman Award from the Pennsylvania ACE-NETWORK for her work in the advancement of women in higher education; and in 2004, the Athena Award presented by Harrisburg Regional Chamber and Capital Area Region Economic Development Corporation. Dr. Hanes is currently serving as the Chair for the ACE Office of Women in Higher Education.
